## DEAR FRIENDS OF LOCAL EDUCATION & ACTIVITIES FOUNDATION,

Last year I shared that we had exceeded our strategic goals of increasing our endowment and increasing our annual financial impact to District 742 students. We also invited supporters to help us reach one million dollars in total endowment funds. We are happy to report that as of December 2014 our total endowment reached \$1,004,950.90! In the 2013-2014 school year we granted over \$132,000 to District 742 academics, activities, arts and athletics. Through year end in the 2014-2015 school year we have granted nearly \$70,000 to district programs. Details on these grants can be found elsewhere in this annual report and on our website.

Not only have we been able to increase our endowment compliments of our donors and increase our financial impact through successful ongoing programs such as *Night of The Stars*, Adopt a Classroom, Learning Renaissance fundraiser for academic and our annual campaign, we have been asked and have helped create new funds to benefit students. With the input of parents of the District Immersion program, we helped create the District 742 Immersion Program Fund to help fund the Chinese and Spanish Immersion Programs. When we were approached by concerned community members we helped create the Homeless Student Services Fund that provides financial assistance for the homeless students of District 742. We are working with District representatives and program participants to make these funds as successful as our activities fund, academics fund and many legacy funds.

We were also fortunate enough to receive an innovation grant from the Center for Nonprofit Excellence and Social Innovation (CNESI). That grant benefited the PAKRAT program.

As we reflect on our current successes and new initiatives, we look back in our history and note that our endowment has grown more than threefold in the last ten years and our annual district financial impact has grown six fold during that time. We are grateful to our many supporters, hard-working volunteers and generous donors, who without their commitment and dedication, none of this would be possible. Although we are pleased to, once again, help increase our impact to district students, the more we do each year, the more we recognize that much more needs to be done to help our students, our district and our community. We thank you for all you do to help us help our students.

## INNOVATION AWARD FROM CNESI

The District 742 Local Education & Activities Foundation received the 2014 Innovation Award from the Center for Nonprofit Excellence and Innovation (CNESI). CNESI defines innovation as "A novel solution to a social problem this is more effective, efficient, sustainable, or just, than existing solutions for for which the value created accrues primarily to society as a whole rather than private individuals".

LEAF won the award for the PAKRAT program, an innovative child literacy and parent involvement program which LEAF has been supporting for the past three years. With LEAF's support, PAKRAT has been expanded to all K-3 elementary schools in District 742. Recently it was expanded to all preschool programs. With help from a grant from the Otto Bremer Foundation, LEAF is now able to include PAKRAT books in all three St. Cloud Boys & Girls Clubs to provide an opportunity for students who don't go home after school or who don't have a caregiver at home that can read with them. The grant also provides an expansion of the PAKRAT libraries in all District elementary schools and provides funding for the summer Read and Roll Program in the Talahi attendance area.

LEAF is honored to receive this recognition from CNESI. A special Thanks goes to Mary Dank, retired Talahi teacher who brought the PAKRAT idea to St. Cloud, Sara Martini who serves as our PAKRAT district coordinator and the LEAF Board for providing ongoing support for the literacy goal of all students reading at grade-level by grade 3.

## LEAF BEGINS TWO NEW FUNDS

### LEAF HOMELESS STUDENT SERVICES FUND

Recently, LEAF was approached by a group of citizens who asked if LEAF would start a fund to provide assistance to our homeless students to help ensure that they have as fair an opportunity to access the quality educational program as other students. Every day homeless students face the daunting task of focusing on a quality education while worrying about the basic needs of reliable food, clothing and shelter. The result was the establishment of the LEAF Homeless Student Services Fund, designed to provide opportunities for homeless students in District 742. The fund has attracted a great deal of community support in a short time and within a month has grown to over \$27,000! The response to the LEAF Homeless Student Services Fund shows the compassion of St. Cloud area residents and delivers a message of support to our homeless students!

### DISTRICT 742 IMMERSION PROGRAM FUND

District 742 has two quality Immersion Programs. The Spanish Immersion Program is offered at Clearview Elementary and South Junior High School, while the Chinese Immersion Program is offered at Madison elementary and North Junior High School. This past fall parents with students in both programs approached LEAF regarding a fund specifically set up to provide supplemental assistance to these quality programs. The LEAF Immersion Program Fund has two sub-funds; one for the Spanish Program and one for the Chinese Program. Donors may contribute to either program through LEAF. In addition, an endowed fund of \$50,000 has been established through a generous grant from the Morgan Family Foundation. Donors may also choose to support the endowed fund which will provide assistance to both Immersion Programs.



## LEGACY FUNDS

Major gifts from generous donors provide a solid foundation for the success of LEAF. Gifts of \$25,000 or more (given over a period of up to 5 years) allow donors to set up a Legacy Fund within LEAF that can be directed to benefit a specific activity or educational program, or be given in the donor's name to a program/activity chosen through the LEAF grant process.

# PAKRAT Progress

## LEAF RECEIVES OTTO BREMER FOUNDATION GRANT

In late May, 2014, LEAF received a \$29,414 grant from the Otto Bremer Foundation for the purpose of supporting the District 742 Partners And Kids Reading A lot Together (PAKRAT) program. PAKRAT is a preschool through grade 3 child literacy and parent involvement program. This grant will allow the PAKRAT program to continue in during the 2014-15 school year in 9 District 742 elementary schools. With LEAF's assistance, the PAKRAT program has been expanded to include all District 742 students in grades preschool through third grade.

As a result of the Otto Bremer Foundation grant, additional books and needed supplies were purchased for each building PAKRAT library. Also, the PAKRAT program was expanded to the three St. Cloud Boys and Girls Club locations. Finally, funds were available to run the 2014 summer Roll & Read Program for the Talahi attendance area. The Read & Roll program delivers books to several locations in the Talahi attendance area and is available for students attending any District 742 elementary school.

## PAKRAT SUMMER ROLL & READ BUS PROGRAM

With the success of the Talahi summer Roll & Read program, LEAF is supporting an effort to expand that summer program to all District 742 elementary school attendance areas! Research shows that 85% of the achievement gap is caused by the "summer slide" where, especially low income students are not exposed to quality reading material. The intention is to provide these quality reading materials via a renovated school bus which will make stops throughout the district on three days per week during the summer months.
